Call to Order and Roll Call

The regular meeting of the Vancouver City Council was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Pro Tem Stober. This meeting was conducted as a hybrid meeting, including both in person and remotely over video conference.

Present: Councilmembers Harless, Perez, Fox, Paulsen, Stober, and Hansen

Absent: Mayor McEnerny-Ogle

Councilmember Harless attended remotely.

Councilmember Hansen motioned to excuse Mayor McEnerny-Ogle from the Council meeting, seconded by Councilmember Fox, and carried unanimously to approve the absence.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes - August 1, 2022

Motion by Councilmember Hansen, seconded by Councilmember Fox, and carried 5-0 to approve the meeting minutes of August 1, 2022. Councilmember Paulsen Abstained from the vote.

Minutes - August 8, 2022

Motion by Councilmember Fox, seconded by Councilmember Hansen, and carried unanimously to approve the meeting minutes of August 8, 2022.

Mayor Pro Tem Stober read and presented a proclamation proclaiming October 2022, as Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Consent Agenda (Items 1-6)

Council requested Item 1 to be pulled.

Motion by Councilmember Paulsen, seconded by Councilmember Hansen, and approved unanimously to approve Items 2-6 on the Consent Agenda.

Co-Chairs, Mel Cox and Courtney Best of the Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association, provided a summary of the work they did to create the Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association. William Cooley, Community Engagement Manager, and Daisy Quinonez, Neighborhood Coordinator, provided a brief summary of the Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association.

Motion by Councilmember Hansen, seconded by Councilmember Paulsen, and approved unanimously to approve Item 1 on the Consent Agenda.

1. Recognition of Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association

Staff Report: 144-22

A RESOLUTION recognizing the Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association by City Council and providing that City Council intends to consult with the neighborhood association and to consider recommendations of the

Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association on any matter found to affect the livability of the Emerald Landing neighborhood.

Residents of the area met on Jan.24, Feb. 7, Feb. 25 and May 2, 2022 and voted to form a neighborhood association, to be called the Emerald Landing Neighborhood Association. They established boundaries, adopted bylaws, and voted in officers. They have met all requirements to become formally recognized by City Council.

Request: Staff recommends the adoption of a resolution formally recognizing the Emerald Landing Neighborhood as the City's 70th official neighborhood association.

2. Construction Acceptance - Port Pump Station Replacement

Staff Report: 145-22

Rotschy, Inc. of Vancouver, Washington, has completed construction of the Port Pump Station Replacement project. The project provided a new, more efficient pump station. The prior station was a wet well/dry well configuration which required operations staff to make entries into a confined space to maintain the system. It was converted into a submersible station that now allows most maintenance activities to be completed above ground. The station has also been upgraded to current standards for SCADA, electrical and all other standardized site requirements.

The work was completed satisfactorily in accordance with the plans and specifications. Contract costs are summarized below:

Retainage	\$58,834.02

The original contract amount, including sales tax, was \$1,394,080.04. The final project cost was \$1,276,698.13, which was \$117,381.91 (approx. 8.4%) less than the original contracted amount. The difference between original contract amount and final contract amount can be attributed to typical variances in unit prices and/or quantities commonly encountered during construction.

The Engineer's Estimate fell within the \$500,000 to \$1,500,000 threshold that would require an apprenticeship utilization of 3%. The contractor had a

minimum utilization of 137.2 working hours to achieve the 3% requirement.

Rotschy, Inc. exceeded the minimum hours required by utilizing 187 apprenticeship hours (4%).

Request: On October 10, 2022, accept the facilities as constructed by Rotschy, Inc. of Vancouver, Washington, and authorize release of the retainage in the amount of \$58,834.02 subject to receipt of all documentation required by law.

3. Professional Services Agreement Extension and Increase - Herrera Environmental Consultants

Staff Report: 146-22

The City currently contracts with Herrera Environmental Inc. to conduct water quality monitoring in the Columbia Slope watershed. The initial project scope included 12 monitoring events at ten sites for 12 months. This expanded contract will cover an additional 18 monitoring events at 12 locations with work beginning in October 2022. The scope of work includes data review and analysis and a final technical report due in August 2024. The current contract has an end date of October 2022.

To provide for seamless data collection, staff is requesting an increase of the professional services contract to \$630,353 and to extend the contract through August 31, 2024 to support additional data collection and analyses and inform future stormwater management activities. This increase will be funded in the Surface Water capital budget and in part by a Clean Water Act Section 123 grant through the Columbia Basin Restoration Program.

Request: Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute a contract amendment increasing the maximum amount payable to Herrera Environmental Consultants Inc. for professional services by \$381,000 to a not-to-exceed contract amount of \$630,353 and extend the effective date of the contract to August 31, 2024.

4. Name Recommendation for New Park in Rose Village Neighborhood as “Ida Bell Jones Park”

Staff Report: 147-22

A RESOLUTION naming the neighborhood park informally known as “New

Park in Rose Village” at T Street and East 35th Street, on the parcel located at 3408 T Street, Vancouver, Washington 98663, as “Ida Bell Jones Park.”

Today, the neighborhood surrounding the park site is very diverse. Based on the most recent school data, 58 percent of students at the nearby elementary school identify as a race or ethnicity other than white. The Rose Village neighborhood ranks as having high and very high need for investment according to the City of Vancouver Equity Index map. The PNC believes that naming government parks, buildings, and structures is an important task that should be thought provoking, educational and encourage representational naming where there is a logical connection. Naming the new park after a Black woman who was instrumental in building a strong sense of community in the Rose Village neighborhood and throughout Vancouver during a pivotal period of growth for the City seemsis a geographically and historically appropriate recognition.

The PNC believes that naming government parks, buildings, and structures is an important task that should be thought provoking, educational and encourage representational naming where there is a logical connection.

Request: On October 10, 2022 adopt a resolution naming the neighborhood park located at T Street and 35th Avenue as “Ida Bell Jones Park” as the official name of the new park in Rose Village, and to direct staff to update signage as needed.

5. Appointment to the Culture, Arts and Heritage Commission

The City’s Culture, Art and Heritage Commission is a nine-member volunteer group responsible for facilitating the development and promotion of a thriving cultural, art and heritage environment that reflects the people we serve. This is accomplished through the creation of community-informed programs, ownership of buildings and public art, and a commitment to community partnerships.

Council Subcommittee 2 recently interviewed four candidates for two mid-term vacancies on the Culture, Arts & Heritage Commission. They recommend the appointment of Brad Richardson and Julie Mercado, with terms beginning immediately and expiring December 2023 and December 2024, respectively.

Request: Appoint Brad Richardson and Julie Mercado to the Culture, Arts and Heritage Commission; Brad's term would begin immediately and expire December 31, 2023 and Julie's term would begin immediately and expire December 31, 2024.

Motion approved the request.
