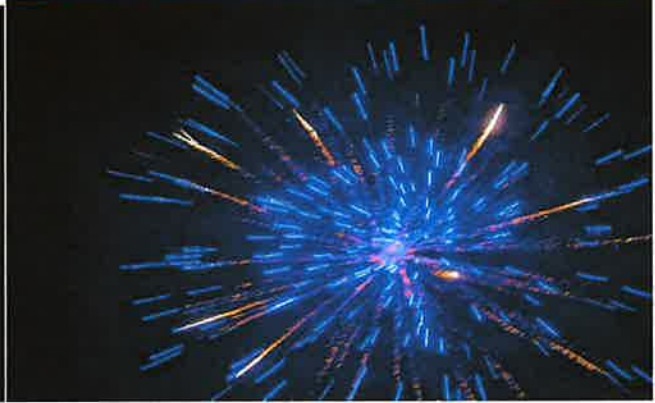

On July 7, 2026, at about 9:41 a.m., Vancouver Police responded to reports of a shooting near the 1400 block of SE Columbia Way.

Officers learned the incident began when a man walking his dog confronted another man who was urinating in public. During the confrontation, the man accused the dog walker of displaying a firearm and left the area to get his uncle.

When the uncle arrived, he also confronted the dog walker over the alleged firearm. During the confrontation, the dog walker sprayed him with pepper spray. The uncle then pulled out a handgun, and the two began fighting over it. During the struggle, two rounds were fired, narrowly missing the dog walker. No one was struck by the gunfire.

The uncle, 31-year-old Simba Dattilio, was arrested and booked into the Clark County Jail two counts of first-degree assault.

Plan for growth and development approved

Vancouver is expected to grow by 81,000 people by 2045. This means we need at least 38,000 more homes and 43,000 more jobs to help keep Vancouver livable and affordable.

On June 1, the City of Vancouver approved a plan to guide this growth: the updated Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Code. These documents will influence where homes, jobs, parks, streets, and public services go and how they look and function. Changes will happen slowly over the next 20 years as property owners bring forward new projects and as the City puts the plan into action.

The updates were made with three years of community input — thank you to everyone who shared ideas and helped shape our city's future!
