Pledge of Allegiance

Call to Order and Roll Call

The regular meeting of the Vancouver City Council was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor McEnerny-Ogle. This meeting was conducted as a hybrid meeting, including both in person and remotely over video conference.

Proclamations: Arbor Month

Mayor McEnerny-Ogle read and presented a proclamation to Melissa Johnston, Urban Forestry Commission Chair, proclaiming April 2023, as Arbor Month and April 12, 2023, as Arbor Day.

Consent Agenda (Items 1-8)

Motion by Councilmember Stober, seconded by Councilmember Perez, and carried unanimously to approve the Consent Agenda.

1. 2023 Slurry Seal Project

Staff Report: 044-23

On March 9, 2021, the City received bids for the 2021 Joint Agency Slurry Seal Project, which was awarded to Blackline, Inc, of Vancouver, Washington with the City of Vancouver's portion of the work being approved for \$276,155. As part of the bid, the contractor executed a separate contract with each agency. In addition, the participating agencies reserved the right to extend the contract for two (2) one (1) year periods with the same terms and conditions and the option to review unit prices for adjustment due to inflation and amount of work.

At the end of 2022, the City and Clark County discussed a contract extension with Blackline for 2023 and decided that it was in our best interests to do so. All 2023 work quantities were sent to Blackline, Inc. and proposed 2023 pricing was agreed upon for the unit bid items. The 2023 City of Vancouver portion of the work is \$381,490. The Engineer's Estimate for this amendment was less than the threshold to require an apprenticeship utilization goal.

Request: On April 3, 2023, amend the Blackline, Inc, of Vancouver, Washington construction contract for the 2023 Joint Agency Slurry Seal Project for sealing for one (1) additional year for their adjusted bid price of \$381,490.00, which includes Washington State sales tax.

2. 2023 Fourth Plain Blvd Curb Ramps

Staff Report: 045-23

The City is issuing three separate curb ramp contracts this year as part of its 2023 pavement management program. These contracts include the

“2023 Fourth Plain Blvd Curb Ramps”, the “2023 East Curb Ramps”, the “2023 West Curb Ramps”. The purpose of splitting the work into three contracts is to reduce each contract to a manageable size, which helps expedite ramp construction. From a construction sequencing standpoint, it is far more efficient to construct the new curb ramps in advance of the on-street pavement management resurfacing work.

This staff report and recommended action is to award the 2023 Fourth Plain Blvd Curb Ramps contract only. Recommendations to award the East Curb Ramps project and West Curb Ramps project will follow at a later date. On March 14, 2023, the City received four bids for the subject project.

The bids ranged between \$854,350.50 to \$1,275,725.00. The low bidder was responsive. The bids are as follows:

There is a minimum apprenticeship goal of 3% of the utilized labor hours for this project. Western United Civil Group, LLC, Yacolt, Washington has submitted an Apprenticeship Utilization Plan to meet or exceed this goal by using approximately 160 hours of apprentice time of the estimating a total of 2,150 applicable labor hours for the project.

Request: On April 3, 2023, award a construction contract for the 2023 Fourth Plain Blvd Curb Ramps - Main St to Fort Vancouver Way project to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and authorize the City Manager or their designee, to sign a contract with Western United Civil Group, LLC, Yacolt, WA at their bid price of \$854,350.50, which includes Washington State sales tax.

3. **Continued use of Washington State contract 08215 for procurement of Information Technology (IT) temporary staff augmentation services from TEKsystems, Inc.**

Staff Report: 046-23

The City uses Washington State contract #08215 to purchase IT staff

augmentation services. The contract allows IT to provide technology staffing augmentation for relatively short-term projects or to quickly backfill vacancies until a permanent hire can be made.

The City is requesting authorization to continue to use the contract to purchase up to the Council-approved budgeted amount for these services through the end of the contract, which is 1/31/2026, and into any extended period negotiated by the State of Washington.

Request: Authorize the City Manager or their designee to approve purchases under Washington State contract 08215 for the life of the contract with TEKsystems, Inc. dba Allegis Group Holdings Inc.

4. Increase the spending limit for Contract C-91441 - Cascade Fire Equipment

Staff Report: 047-23

The time to manufacture a fire engine has recently doubled, going from a typical timeline of 430 days to as much as 720-750 days. Vancouver currently has two pumpers due for replacement this calendar year followed by two more in 2024. To maximize benefits from volume purchasing and standardize platforms, the fleet division and budget office are seeking a contract amendment to allow the purchase of these four fire engines/pumpers from a single vendor. This will minimize having to extend the lifecycles of existing units (due to the longer lead times for the 2024 order), and the remaining authorized purchase authority left on this contract is not enough to accommodate this purchase. Staff is requesting an increase to the previous Council authorized limit to support these purchases, increasing this contract to allow purchases up to the department's' current authorized budget for these scheduled replacements in lieu of setting a new spending threshold.

Request: Authorize the City Manager or their designee to approve purchases under C-91441 for the life of the contract with Cascade Fire Equipment up to the current authorized budget.

5. Purchasing Contract Spending Limit Increase for Fire Department Turnout Gear to Allow Gear Purchases for New Recruits

Staff Report: 048-23

The City of Vancouver Fire Department uses the C-100867 Piggyback NPP-GOV PS 20065 RFP 1915 for the purchase of turnout gear. The turnout needs of the fire department can vary dramatically from year to year based on hiring and turnout gear reaching the end of its 10-year life span. Additionally, the equipment offerings from each contracted company can shift often as well. Due in part to these reasons the current contract limit amount with Seawestern will be reached by the Second Quarter of 2023. The Fire Department would like authorization to continue to use the contract to purchase up to the Council-approved annual budgeted amount for turnouts.

Request: Authorize the City Manager, or their designee, to approve purchases under the C-100867 Piggyback NPP-GOV PS 20065 RFP 1915 Lion Turnout Gear.

6. Extension of Contract with Live Love Outreach for Management of Safe Stay Community #2

Staff Report: 049-23

An estimated 500-600 individuals reside in tents or vehicles within the City of Vancouver, which poses significant health and safety risks to the individuals experiencing unsheltered homelessness, as well as the rest of the community and the environment. At this time, our community does not have an adequate supply of shelter or housing options to meet the growing need. This Council has observed that many individuals who live outdoors on public property do so, not by choice, but due to a lack of financial means to afford adequate shelter. These individuals are adversely mentally and physically impacted by outdoor habitation. Single female encampment occupants experience a disproportionately high incidence of violent crime, as compared to other people. Families with children who live outdoors, as a result of a lack adequate shelter, are also disproportionately adversely impacted through risk of physical danger and impediments to childhood education.

Simultaneously, Council has also observed that the City's sensitive ecological areas are adversely impacted by secondary impacts of outdoor habitation. The City's sensitive waterways, water treatment facilities, stormwater and wastewater facilities are particularly vulnerable to impacts of illegal dumping and improper disposal of human waste. Additionally, individuals living outdoors in greenways and wooded areas, who utilize fire as a source of heat, or to cook with, increase the potential for wildfire in

those areas, particularly during our dry/summer months.

In an effort to reduce the aforementioned negative impacts of unsheltered homelessness, provide for greater safety, stability, and access to needed services for individuals experiencing unsheltered homelessness, and to remain in compliance with Martin v. Boise, this Council has approved the establishment of city-sponsored Safe Stay Communities in designated areas. These Communities are managed and supported by contracted service providers who work to:

- ensure safety and sanitation within and immediately surrounding the designated Community;*
- assist Safe Stay Community residents with obtaining stability, accessing needed resources, and transitioning into a more permanent housing situation; and*
- proactively engage with the surrounding neighborhood(s) to mitigate potential negative impacts to the neighborhood, facilitate neighborhood participation and volunteer opportunities within the designated Community, and encourage participation in neighborhood/community events, neighborhood association meetings, etc. amongst Safe Stay Community residents.*

Request: The amendment and extension of a professional services contract to Live Love Outreach of Vancouver, WA, and to authorize the City Manager, or their designee, to execute a contract for delivery of supportive services and site management at city-sanctioned Safe Stay Community #2.

7. Amend contract with Selectron Technologies to include online permit applications

Staff Report: 051-23

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City Manager or designee to execute an Amendment to the City's Agreement with Selectron Technologies, Inc., an Oregon corporation (hereinafter "Contractor"), for the provision of additional software and materials, beyond those approved by way of Ordinance M-4339, identified more particularly in the Amendment (collectively "Licensed Software") for the benefit of providing customers of the City of Vancouver, Washington ("City") with upgraded portal for Community Development Permit Applications; providing for severability; and setting an effective date.

Community Development implemented the current Infor Dynamic Portal solution in April 2013. The system is outdated and is not efficient for our customers or staff. Although the system works, it lacks many of the modern

features and the user experience that you would find in today's e-commerce sites. A decision package to replace the current Dynamic Portal system was approved in the 2022 First Supplemental Budget.

Request: On Monday, April 3, 2023, approve ordinance on first reading, setting date of second reading and public hearing for Monday, April 10, 2023.

Subject: Trees Cut Down by the Unhoused along Burnt Bridge Creek Jun 22, 2022 – Mar 6, 2023

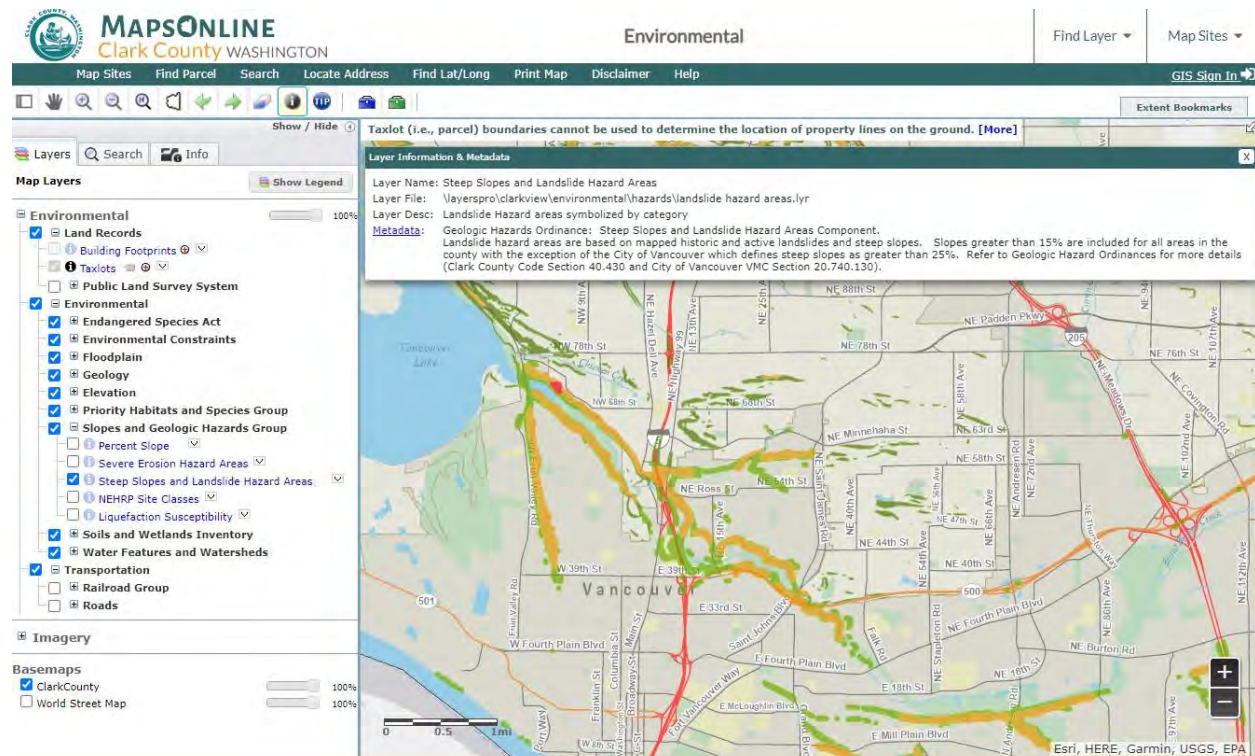
Burnt Bridge Creek is lined by Steep Slopes and Landslide Hazards Areas

Trees and Ground Vegetation helps stabilize forested slopes by providing root strength and by modifying the saturated soil water regime. Plant roots can anchor through the soil mass into fractures in bedrock, can cross zones of weakness to more stable soil, and can provide interlocking long fibrous binders within a weak soil mass.

Landslide frequency can increase after trees are removed from forested slopes.

Here is a Map of the Area and Photos of recent destruction of Urban Forests by the Unhouse Cutting down of Trees and Ground Vegetation so they can Live on the Land in our Urban Forests.

A colleague of mine, Dr. David Jernigan treats vaccine injured patients successfully in Tennessee. He called me after I posted the results on Infrared Spectroscopy and electrical conductivity of live blood and confirmed all of my findings. He shared with me, that a short time ago some family members were eating meat and got very ill from it. This would explain to me why I see these live blood structures in everyone. It does not matter if the products are organic or not.

The next step is to find a local source and maybe do live blood analysis on cows or pigs. If they are contaminated even if unvaccinated, then this may be environmental, possibly via geoengineering spraying. The implications for humanity are profound. I asked my colleague Dr. David Nixon in Australia to replicate my findings, and we will ask Matt Taylor in Ecuador and Shimon Yanowitz in Israel. We need to verify these findings around the world. I will continue working with Dr. Jernigan.

Intent

Provide an initial opportunity for the Council and Planning Commission to discuss integrating equitable processes and outcomes into the Comprehensive Plan Update, and collect initial thoughts and feedback that will feed into the Plan's Equity Framework.

Background

The City of Vancouver's Comprehensive Plan provides the overall long-term vision and policy direction for managing the built and natural environment in Vancouver and providing necessary public facilities to achieve that vision. The City adopted its first comprehensive plan under Washington's Growth Management Act in 1994 (Chapter 36.70A RCW), with a major re-write occurring in 2004, and a less substantive update occurring most recently in 2011.

On February 27, 2023, City Council authorized a resolution which established a chartering process to update the City's Comprehensive Plan and Title 20 Land Use Code, consistent with regulatory requirements under the Growth Management Act, and in response to recent changes that have occurred in the community. The first major milestone in that charter is to develop an overarching equity framework that serves as a foundation for the overall effort and does the following:

- Acknowledges existing and historical inequities as well as local efforts to catalyze change that results in different outcomes in the future;
- Clearly articulates how historically underrepresented, excluded and negatively impacted communities will be elevated during the process;
- Ensure such communities have meaningful and tangible opportunities to lead process and policy design;
- Define what equity means for the project and how success will be measured;
- Differentiate between equitable process development and equitable outcomes; and
- Serve as a decision-making framework for which goals, objectives, policies, and implementation methods are established.

Project Scope

The equity framework that is established will directly influence how the remaining process will be designed, facilitated and executed. Below are the five key tasks that have been identified during the scoping process, and how they relate to the chartering framework that was adopted:

Task	Integrating Element	Description
Community Partnership	- Equity Framework - Community Partnership Framework	Establish a process to develop and create the plan with members of the community, and conduct community engagement activities in a method consistent with state law.
Comprehensive Plan	- Goals Framework - Land Use Framework - Policies	Perform a holistic re-write of the existing Comprehensive Plan, that includes defining a new set of goals, objectives, policies, and overall strategy that responds to the issues and needs identified during the process of co-creation with plan stakeholders and the public as well as data and analysis of long-term trends that will affect the community in the future. The plan strategy will establish an overall land use framework that specifies where and how the City will grow and the infrastructure needs necessary to achieve that vision, as well as overall strategies related to housing, climate, environment, resiliency, community health, public facilities and services, economic development and opportunity, and achieving equitable outcomes.
Implementation Strategy	Implementation Methods	Develop a detailed strategy for implementing the goals, objectives, policies, and overall strategy outlined within the revised plan, including recommendations for future programs and policy work, and a public facing tool to help staff and members of the public understand how implementation of the plan is progressing over the long term.
Title 20 Land Use Code Update	- Code Concepts - Code Framework	Modify the existing zoning code (Title 20 of the Vancouver Municipal Code) to reflect the goals and policies identified in the revised plan and achieve the community's vision;
CEQA	Inputs will be derived from preferred alternative identified in the Land Use Framework	Complete the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process in compliance with the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA);

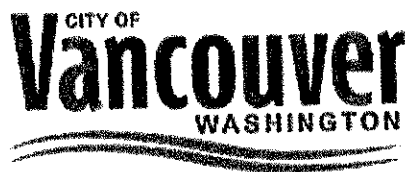

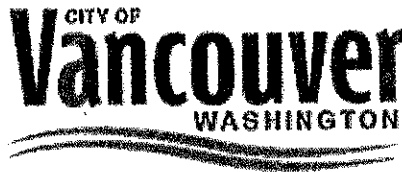

GET US OUT! OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Get US out! of the UN with H.R. 7806

Simply by its continuing existence, the United Nations grows stronger every day. If not combated and discredited, it will become what its creators have always sought — a world tyranny. But the UN cannot achieve its desired world rule without undermining what remains of the independence of the United States. Should the U.S. sever its ties to the world body, the UN would fade into obscurity, even disappear, as did its League of Nations predecessor.

The United States must remain strongly independent. But a progression of our nation's leaders continuously given evidence of their willingness to carry out steps that amount to committing suicide.

As he campaigned for reelection in 1916, President Woodrow Wilson repeatedly claimed that our nation would not join the then-raging European war. Each such pledge was a bald-faced lie, and our nation did enter World War I because Wilson and likeminded partisans knew that war always means more government. And it even could be employed as the reason to cede sovereignty to a world government — which was the underlying goal Wilson and his allies really wanted.

So, World War I ended and immediately, moves to create a world government led by the League of Nations were launched. Happily, there were enough U.S. senators — the group known as the Irreconcilables — who blocked the Wilson-led plan. The League did win approval from enough other nations to get started but, without U.S. involvement, it never amounted to a serious threat, as posed by its United Nations successor.

The U.S. Senate's rejection of the League of Nations led to the formation of the New York-based Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) in 1921. From its outset, the CFR called for world government to be attained by adopting socialism, scrapping the U.S. Constitution, and other frightening actions. Another war was needed, something President Franklin Roosevelt took steps to bring about. World War II ended in 1945 shortly after the use of the atomic bomb on two Japanese cities. Fear of this new devastating weapon cemented Senate acquiescence to making the U.S. one of the founding nations of the new United Nations. From 50 member nations in 1945, the UN has grown to include 193 nations.

Led by an array of pro-UN partisans, American presidents and congressional leaders have moved our nation steadily toward UN rule and allowed the UN to "rescue" our nation from decades of suicidal policies. For instance, the last year when the U.S. government had a balanced budget was 2001. Currently, the U.S. national debt is over \$31 trillion and there seems to be no plan to deal with this recklessness. But the UN has a plan, and it involves replacing the dollar with a form of currency issued by the UN.

The number of illegal aliens crossing into the U.S. through our southern border has escalated to several million per year. A nation without borders is a nation committing suicide. Be assured that the UN has its own plan to deal with America's continued lack of border protection.

Supplying armaments, advisors, and funds to Ukraine to deal with Russia's invasion is bringing our nation — and others — into that war. Additional involvement by the U.S. with troop deployments is a distinct possibility. The UN stands ready to settle the conflict while improving its increasing dominance over participating nations.

In these and other areas of real concern, the U.S. is weakening itself and opening doors leading to further expansion of the UN's escalating power.

Is there a way out of this danger to continued existence as a free and independent United States? The answer is yes, and returning to sanity must begin with U.S. withdrawal from the world body. Let's make support for full withdrawal a major issue, especially with 2022 being an election year with every seat in the House of Representatives and a third of the Senate up for grabs.

Contact incumbents and candidates — in both the House and Senate — and urge them to support H.R. 7806, the American Sovereignty Restoration Act. And when specifically contacting your senators or candidates for Senate, urge them to introduce a companion bill in

the chamber.

Sponsored by Representative Mike Rogers (R-Ala.) and cosponsored by four other representatives, H.R. 7806 would fully withdraw the U.S. from the UN and all its associated agencies. In other words, passage of this measure will free the U.S. from the ever-growing power of the UN that threatens to control all nations and peoples.

In addition to contacting your officials and candidates, spread the word to others in your community about this topic. A simple way to do this is to share our legislative alert "*Get US Out!* of the UN" at <https://gojt.us/p6y5>. Our alert will both educate them about the importance of UN withdrawal and give them an easy way to contact their U.S. representatives and senators.

Total loss of U.S. sovereignty is not inevitable. We can save our Republic from the UN's clutches, if we take organized and decisive action.

I support the moratorium on large warehouses.

Your Climate Action Framework established an aggressive timeline for reducing ghg emissions.

If new parking lots are built without being EV ready for 100% of the vehicles, then it will be difficult for any truck fleet to switch when EV trucks become more available, because retrofits and remodels are much more expensive than newly built projects.

If Clark Public Utilities can't provide energy for the EV fleets, and if the roof is not solar ready, that will be a problem.

I agree that we don't want fleet operators to drive through Vancouver in old diesel trucks to Minnehaha or North Orchards, and I don't think they want to do that either.

There are no easy answers, but maybe the easiest best answer is:

- to make all warehouse roofs solar ready
- to make all parking lots EV ready, for all vehicles.
- to make all heating systems electric ready.

Many incentives are available from the Inflation Reduction Act, and the previous bipartisan infrastructure bill, and also from Olympia via our two cap and invest programs. Their first auction for pollution permits will be tomorrow, and is expected to raise billions from those who pollute. Maybe our Chamber of Commerce could help businesses identify those opportunities.

I have testified in support of the Moratorium on large warehouses, and although far outnumbered by economic and business/developer interests who warned of "unintended consequences" and attempted to derail the work underway, I appreciate that the Moratorium in a revised and amended form is before you for approval.

I appreciate that staff will follow through on studying the potential impacts and concerns that many of us in the community have about these large scale warehouses, and in particular those related to climate, public health, safety and livability in all parts of our community.

I remember back in 2019 when our Port of Vancouver was considering a Renewable Energy Policy that committed our Port to excluding new bulk fossil fuel facilities on Port industrial property. There were voices at the time, business and development oriented primarily, that warned of "unintended consequences" saying that business and development would get a negative message about our Port being "open for business" and that our community's economic well being would suffer.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this warehouse ordinance.

I live in White Salmon, Washington and serve on the Hood River County Energy Council. I don't have knowledge of Vancouver's planning or zoning issues, but I have recommendations regarding the energy and emissions issues and opportunities with new or existing warehouses.

In summary, western Washington and Oregon have an energy problem. CETA in Washington and HB 2021 in Oregon require major utilities to decarbonize most of their electricity by 2030, while electrifying transportation and serving a growing population. The best wind and solar resources for such new generation are east of the Cascades, the large loads are west, and permitting new transmission across the Cascades is nearly impossible. The transmission capacity shortage by 2025 or 2030 is many times the planned new transmission. Thus, the whole I-5 corridor needs to be planning for solar panels in as many places as acceptable. Land use advocates don't want farms turned into solar farms and many communities don't want to see hillsides covered by solar panels.

Warehouses are already eyesores, and their flat roofs are perfect for economical solar arrays. For a typical large commercial roof, solar power generation is about 7.5 watts per square foot; thus each 500,000 square foot warehouse can generate up to 3.8 megawatts, or enough to power about 440 homes. Such arrays could be owned as community solar, owned by the warehouse owner, or owned by anyone. A large warehouse is a perfect location for a good-sized microgrid that can also provide resilient power and high-power EV chargers for DC fast chargers or for the trucks at the loading bays, which will be electrified as those vehicles and charging equipment become available.

Regardless of the council decisions regarding warehouse locations, I recommend that any new warehouse be required to be microgrid-ready, meaning that the roof space is available for anyone to lease for installing and operating PV arrays; that there is space reserved for the power distribution, control, and storage equipment; and that truck parking be EV-ready, meaning conduits are installed and space for charging equipment is reserved. To the degree feasible, existing warehouses should also be required to allow such PV installations on their roofs, plus leasable space for the electrical equipment, etc.

Truck emissions are currently a major concern, but those fleets will mostly be electrified and thus become zero-emission over the next decade.

Thank you for this opportunity to comment on building out new infrastructure.

Good afternoon, Council.

I am unable to attend the meeting tonight but wanted to pass along a few notes. With regards to the warehouse moratorium, I thought it would be prudent to point out a few unintended impacts.

As small family sized development company who develops industrial product, we often develop projects over 100k SF simply by nature of the available land for sale. Economical, readily developable industrial land is scarce and we don't have the luxury of choosing smaller sites vs larger sites. We often build a building to maximize the site attributes and are often limited by size of the parcel. More often than not, that land lends itself to a building larger than 100k SF.

However, these larger buildings are often demised and leased to smaller tenants. Because we are a smaller development firm we often lease facilities to a tenant profile that includes smaller family companies ranging from 10k-50k SF.

I can attest first hand that it does not pencil from an economic perspective to build a smaller facility much below 100k SF. The economy of scale created with a large building is one of the few reasons

projects still "pencil" in this market. In addition, unless you have the perfect small parcel, most parcels would have excess land that has to be purchased but can't be built into the deal. Thus making the project infeasible from an economic perspective.

Our strategy is to focus on larger pieces of land that create economies of scale to build larger warehouses which we can then demise and lease to smaller tenants with reasonable lease rates. Without these economies of scale, the lease rate for a small industrial facility by itself would be far in excess of "market" and therefore push any smaller local tenant out of the market. In my opinion, The City would be foolish to hinder the economic growth of smaller tenants who live and work in the community.

The warehouse moratorium of any buildings over 100k SF will absolutely have an unintended impact on smaller industrial tenants which are vital to economic growth.

I thought I registered to speak but received no confirmation. I could have messed up.

After listening to the discussion tonight, I feel that it would be helpful to think about what your regulation might look like after the moratorium. The sooner you envision that, the sooner the moratorium can be ended. What do we want in terms of emissions reduction and protecting public health?

Here is some context that is relevant.

1. A year ago the Columbian reported that the proposed Amazon Development near East Fourth Plain and 143rd Ave, include covered roadways and parking lots.

I was hoping that meant they would cover those canopies with solar panels, but I haven't seen an update yet.

2. I've also heard that Amazon has ordered 100,000 electric delivery vans, and they already have one serving the Camas area.
3. Daimler-Freightliner is building electric semis on Swan Island.
4. Six years ago, the City of Richmond in British Columbia wanted to require electric charging stations in certain projects, but were not allowed to impose building codes distinct from the provincial codes. To get around that restriction, they put the requirement into their land use ordinance.

5. California is now banning diesel trucks built before 2010. Most likely, those trucks will be sold in neighboring states.

6. We need more electricity and it needs to be clean electricity.

7. On January 18, The port of Camas Washougal entered into an agreement with Clark Public Utilities to develop a large community solar project on their warehouse rooftops. It will be the largest one built west of the Cascades.

8. And you have a goal of reducing emissions community wide

With that in mind, a new ordinance might:

- Require that space and water be heated with electric heat pumps.
- Require adequate charging infrastructure for trucks.
- Require enough on-site solar panels to meet or exceed the need for electricity.
- Require all diesel trucks serving the warehouse to be built after 2009.
- Encourage staff to be more deliberate in their SEPA Determinations

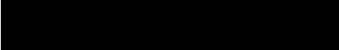

Dear Friends:

A new study (Hall, et al., 2023) led by scientists from Toronto’s York University in the journal *Science of the Total Environment* linked fluoride exposure with an increased risk of hypothyroidism in pregnant women. Fluoridated water was the main source of fluoride in the cohort. The study also looked at a smaller subset of participants with IQ test results in the children and found that mothers who had been diagnosed with hypothyroidism had boys with lower IQ scores than mothers with normal thyroid function.

Entitled, *Fluoride Exposure And Hypothyroidism In A Canadian Pregnancy Cohort*, the study discovered that a half-milligram-per liter increase in drinking water fluoride levels—roughly the difference in exposure level between the fluoridated and non-fluoridated communities—was associated with a 1.65 increase in odds of having a diagnosis or meeting criteria for hypothyroidism in pregnancy.

According to one study author, clinical neuropsychologist Christine Till, PhD, **“The findings are concerning because**

hypothyroidism is a known cause of brain-based disorders in children.” ([York press release](#))

The study's authors say they hope that policy makers will consider this new research when evaluating the safety of community water fluoridation. They say that the fluoride compounds added to tap water are a major source of fluoride exposure for over 200-million people in North America, since approximately four in 10 Canadians and seven out of 10 Americans on public water supplies have fluoridated drinking water.

Women in general are more at risk of developing hypothyroidism, a condition that can lead to symptoms such as fatigue, weight gain and depression. In pregnancy, the demands put on the thyroid system increase substantially, especially in the first trimester when the fetus is solely reliant on maternal thyroid hormones.

The study followed more than 1,500 women participating in a multi-year study called the Maternal Infant Research On Environmental Chemicals ([MIREC](#)) study, led by Health Canada to investigate the impact of environmental chemicals on vulnerable populations, including pregnant women and infants. Women were recruited from 10 cities across Canada, seven of which have fluoridated drinking water. The study's authors only included women who reported drinking tap water during pregnancy, and they followed participants throughout pregnancy, and followed their children into early childhood.

While fluoride's ability to suppress the thyroid [has been known since the 1930s](#) when it was used to treat overactive thyroid—also known as hyperthyroidism—the mechanism by which fluoride may interfere with thyroid function is not entirely clear. The study's lead author, Meaghan Hall, said that it may interfere with certain enzymes and iodine absorption, which is critical for thyroid hormone production.

This study is the strongest to date showing that fluoride causes hypothyroidism, as well as that the mother's hypothyroidism is associated with lower IQ in the child.

It adds to a growing body of evidence that fluoride exposures from artificially fluoridated water is sufficient to impair thyroid function. Earlier studies finding an effect were in a study of nearly the entire population of England [Peckham 2015]; a large nationally representative sample from Canada using the CHMS survey [Malin 2018]; a case-control study in Iran [Kheradpisheh 2018]; and in a large sample of children in China where mean water and urine fluoride levels are only slightly higher than in areas with artificial fluoridation [Wang 2020].

Two studies have not found an association between fluoride at levels relevant to fluoridation and decreased thyroid function, but both suffered limitations that may explain why they did not detect effects [Barberio 2017, Shaik 2019]. The Barberio 2017 study did not consider iodine intake and the Shaik 2019 study selected only children with optimal iodine intake. The Malin 2018 study reanalyzed the same sample as Barberio 2017 but controlled for iodine and found that in those with iodine insufficiency fluoride exposure increased hypothyroidism. This could also explain why no effect was found in the Shaik 2019 study that was restricted to only children with optimal iodine intake.

This latest study's authors also say fluoride levels in tap water may be a more reliable indicator of long-term fluoride

exposure than urinary levels, which might better correlate with short-term exposure, they say.

NTP Will Make Blocked Neurotoxicity Report Public After FAN Legal Action

Dear Friends:

The Fluoride Action Network has won another significant victory involving our federal lawsuit against the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) over the neurotoxicity of fluoridation chemicals.

As a result of months of legal motions, subpoenas, and extensive negotiations with the U.S. Department Of Justice (DOJ)—which is representing the EPA in court—our legal council was successful in getting the National Institutes of Health (NIH) **to agree to publicly release the National Toxicology Program's (NTP) completed multi-year systematic review of fluoride's impact on the developing brain.** After being served a subpoena by our attorneys, the National Institute for Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS)—a branch of NIH—agreed to publicly produce their final report that was intended to be published in May of 2022. **They have until March 15th to upload the documents to the NTP's website, including the monograph, the meta-analysis, and communications between various federal agencies and the NTP about the report.**

This victory will allow the public to finally see the report and accompanying documents that were blocked from being published by the leadership at US Health and Human Services (HHS) in May of 2022. Internal CDC emails discovered through Freedom Of Information Act Requests by FAN indicated that the publication of the final NTP report was blocked at the last second due to interference from the Assistant Health Secretary, Rachel Levine. One email from the CDC's Oral Health Director from June 3rd, 2022 stated, "ASH Levine has put the report on hold until further notice."

Our attorney, Michael Connett, summed up this victory, saying: "This represents a major reversal in the federal agencies' position, and will ensure that the public has access to these critical documents that would have otherwise remained buried forever."

This victory also sets the stage for the Court to move forward with scheduling the dates of the next phase of trial at the upcoming April 11th status hearing rather than adjudicating our motions to compel the NTP to hand over these documents involuntarily. The judge and our attorneys had indicated that the final stages of the trial could occur as soon as this summer or fall. These documents will play a major role in this final phase of the trial, and now the testimony on them will be accessible to the public rather than occurring behind closed doors as would have happened without this agreement.

Some Background Information

The Court has been awaiting the NTP's monograph on fluoride's neurotoxicity since the summer of 2020, when the judge put the case in abeyance after the first two weeks of trial and expert testimony in court, expecting the monograph to be published shortly thereafter. At the time, the NTP report had already undergone two unprecedented peer-reviews by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, And Medicine (NASEM), and its authors had concluded that fluoride was a "presumed developmental neurotoxicant," with 27 out of the 29 highest quality studies showing that fluoride harmed the brains of children, and most of these studies were at levels equivalent to exposures experienced in fluoridated communities.

However, the NTP subjected their fluoride report to additional peer-reviews, beyond the already unprecedented reviews by NASEM and in contrast to previous monographs on other chemicals where there is usually just one public peer-review culminating in a public vote by a panel of scientists.

Freedom of Information Act Requests by FAN and our legal council discovered internal NTP emails confirming that the NTP considered the May 2022 monograph to be their final report. On April 28, 2022, the Director of the NTP's Office of Policy, Review, and Outreach, Dr. Mary Wolfe, emailed the CDC's Oral Health Division Director, stating that the NTP's "analysis and conclusions are set," and that the final report would be made public by "mid/late May" of 2022. Dr. Wolfe later notified the CDC that "we [the NTP] believe the current findings, as stated in the monograph, reflect the scope of our evaluation and the available scientific literature and no revision is needed."

Before FAN even had these communications through FOIA, FAN's legal counsel had become aware that HHS may be exerting undue pressure on NTP. Based on the information that our attorneys had obtained, we filed a motion in September asking the Court to take the case out of abeyance and open up the NTP's final monograph to discovery so we could move forward with a second trial featuring expert testimony on it. The EPA opposed this motion, asking for continued indefinite delay of the trial until the NTP report was officially published, which they admitted might never occur. The Court ruled in favor of our motion, and our trial moved forward with the Judge asking that the NTP's final report be made available to the Court and to Plaintiffs, but under a protective order so the public wouldn't be able to see it.

At the most recent status hearing before the Court in January, the EPA continued to ask for indefinite delay of the trial until the NTP published the monograph themselves, however the Judge acknowledged that "justice delayed is justice denied," ultimately ruling against them. The Court directed the plaintiffs and defendants to start the process of adjudicating whether the final NTP report and accompanying agency comments ought to be made public in preparation for the final phase of the trial.

After months of negotiations and a subpoena, our legal counsel met with NIEHS on February 3rd, and they agreed to

voluntarily release the NTP monograph, as well as comments from representatives of various agencies within HHS, and the NTP's responses to them. The Director of the NIEHS, Dr. Richard Woychik, has claimed that these agency comments led to NTP withholding the monograph from the public.

STAY TUNED! FAN will share these documents with the public as soon as they're made available by the NTP. And don't forget to mark your calendars for the upcoming April 11th status hearing in court, where we're very likely to see the timeline for the final court proceedings set, bringing us a major step closer to a ruling.

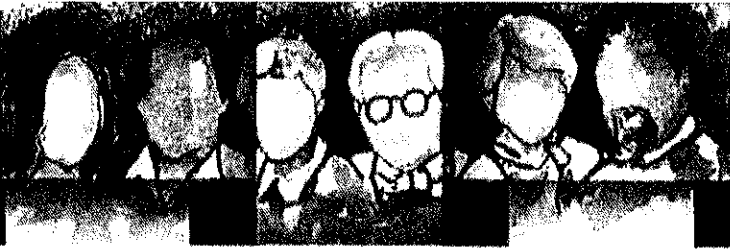

Jail History

- Due to low population, little consideration was given to constructing either a courthouse or a jail. Initially, prisoners, when absolutely necessary were housed first in the gaol (Old English word for jail) of the old Hudson's Bay Fort and later in the military stockade at Fort Vancouver. This arrangement was finally altered with the construction of a jail located just northeast of the two story wooden courthouse constructed two years earlier. This wooden facility was constructed for \$1,555 by Silas Maxon from a special jail tax.
- 1860** On June 13, 1860, Mr. A. H. Sheffield proposed to the Board of County Commissioners that he be allowed to run the jail and be given custody of any prisoners held there for the term of one year for the purpose of "working the prisoners for wages". In turn, Mr. Sheffield would be paid \$1.50 per day and would be responsible for finding the work and watching them. The funds would be paid from the wages that the prisoners earned. The proposal was unanimously accepted by the Board and Mr. Sheffield was made the first official jailer of Clark County.
- 1883** Judicial activity had increased to the point that the decision was made to construct a new courthouse. This courthouse was constructed on the site of the present courthouse. Unlike the original, this one was constructed to house the Sheriff's Office and the jail in the basement.
- 1885** Courthouse and Jail were built for \$44,460. This burned to the ground in 1890. The fire, apparently caused by defective furnace pipes, quickly consumed the whole building. Six prisoners in the jail at this time, all were saved, however singed. The jail was also the holding facility for the "insane" pending judicial determination.
- 1887** The general configuration of the jail is not known. What is known is that it was not escape proof. At least one escape took place on November 1, 1887 when three prisoners were able to construct a "key" that let them out of their cell and escape.
- 1925** Last Hanging, George Edward Whitfield, a twenty year old farm hand, found guilty of rape and murder.
- 1930** 527 arrests were recorded for the year.
- 1931** Jail food costs were bid at 15 cents for breakfast and dinner, and lunch at 10 cents.
- 1933** Great Escape Foiled! Eleven prisoners attempted to tunnel out of the old Bastille Jail digging a 18' tunnel. The dirt was disposed of by flushing it down a toilet.
- 1941** New Courthouse and Jail was built. The Jail was now on the fifth floor of the Clark County Courthouse and opened in December with an operating budget of \$33,335.
- 1943** Average Daily Jail Population fluctuated between 40-70 prisoners.
- 1981** Inmates in the north tank of the courthouse jail riot over excessive temperatures and overcrowding.
- 1984** The Sentencing Reform Act changed the way felons were sentenced, and kept a larger number of inmates in local county jails when they used to go to state prisons.
- The new Law Enforcement Center and Jail Facility opened July 1984, with a jail capacity of 300 beds. Two federal inmates broke out a window and sawed through the bars and escaped from the new jail via the roof.
- 1988** The jail double bunked dormitories adding 50 more beds which increased the jail's capacity to 350.
- 1989** The old City Jail located in the basement of the Vancouver Police Department was reopened as an alternative housing and women's work release facility, adding 28 beds. New jail capacity set at 378. Notorious child killer Wesley Allan Dodd was arrested and booked into the Clark County Jail. Dodd was hanged for his crimes on January 5, 1993 at Walla Walla State Prison.
- 1992** City Jail closed resulting in the loss of 28 beds. The annual average daily population was 426. A lease for two beds for women's work release was contracted with the Royal Arms Shelter. Jail capacity remains at 350.
- 1994** Medium Security Jail cells were double bunked adding 111 additional beds. Jail capacity at 461. Jail population tops capacity with an average daily population of 462. Projections indicated that by the year 2015, Clark County would need a minimum of 1200 beds for local incarceration needs. Jail officials prepare for overcrowding and problems associated with overcrowding.
- 1996** Sheriff Garry Lucas creates a Special Detention Unit with the objective being to site, build and operate a Jail Work Center. A citizen's citing task force was appointed to study and make final sites recommendations to the Sheriff.
- 1997** The jail's annual budget is \$7,986,658. Annual average daily jail population is 561. The County purchases property from Alcoa Company for future development toward a Jail Work Center.

- 2000** The Clark County Jail Work Center opened in April. The facility operates two housing units, the In-Custody and Work Release Unit. The In-Custody Unit has 124 beds and the Work Release Unit has 99 beds.
- 2001** The Medical Services Contract was awarded to Prison Health Services. The medical contractor provides medical services to individuals confined in the Main Jail, Jail Work Center In-Custody, and Juvenile Detention facilities.
- 2006** The former Main jail Work Release area re-opened, designated as "H" Pod. Added an additional 56 beds increasing operational beds to 614, which is over double the number of beds when the facility opened in 1984, for a population that reached a record of 875 inmates.
- The Main Jail facility underwent a retrofit; installed in each cell were tamper proof grills over vents, tamper proof plate covers over cell switches and outlets, and rubber bumpers in hallways eliminating chips in cement walls from various carts used.
- The Jail Work Center Work Release program passed the accreditation process and is an acknowledged American Correctional Association (ACA) facility.
- 2006 - 2007** The Clark County Jail facility underwent a remodel which included; adding four professional visitors booths in the North Lobby, adding four Video Arraignment booths (one dedicated for Battleground Courts), an inmate restroom in one holding area, and half of the current library space to expand the medical unit. The Jail Work Center kitchen floor was replaced.
- 2007** The Clark County Main Jail experienced in March, two completed inmate suicides and in December a first ever hostage situation which ended peacefully with the assistance of the SWAT Team. The last completed suicide was in November 1998.
- The Medical Services Contract was awarded to Wexford Health Sources. The medical contractor provides medical services to individuals confined in the Main Jail, Jail Work Center In-Custody, and Juvenile Detention facilities.
- 2008** In October, the Main Jail had another hostage situation which also ended peacefully.
- 2009** Clark County had a budget deficit requiring two rounds of departmental budget cuts resulting in closure of "H" pod, losing 57 beds in early 2009, and a total of 36 staff positions; 2 sergeants, 32 custody staff, 1 support staff, and 1 jail industry technician.
- 2010** The Clark County Jail was to eliminate 15 staff positions and close 100 beds by 2010. A new contractor for inmate medical services, and the County and Custody Officers Guild agreed to defer a 3.25 percent cost of living raise until 2011. These two agreements saved the 15 staff positions and prevented closure of 100 beds.
- The Medical Services Contract was awarded to ConMed Healthcare Management. The medical contractor provides medical services to individuals confined in the Main Jail, Jail Work Center In-Custody, and Juvenile Detention facilities.
- 2012** The Work Release building at the Jail Work Center is closed due to lower inmate population.
- 2020** The Medical Services Contract was awarded to Naphcare. The medical contractor provides medical services to individuals confined in the Main Jail, Jail Work Center In-Custody, and Juvenile Detention facilities on February 1, 2020.
- 2022** On September 20, 2022, the Clark County Council approved the transfer of management of the Clark County Jail from the Sheriff's Office to the County Manager's Office. An executive leadership team was in place on October 17th to begin the planning of the transition.
- The Medical Services Contract was awarded to WellPath. The medical contractor provides medical services to individuals confined in the Main Jail, Jail Work Center In-Custody, and Juvenile Detention facilities.
- 2023** On January 1st, 2023, the Clark County Department of Jail Services was established. The transition of jail services support and division of workload continues until April 12, 2023 at which time transition ends.
- March 1, 2023 WellPath took over inmate medical care as Clark County Jail's contracted medical provider.

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION METHODS

Mid year of 2021, the Clark County Jail in coordination with the DOJ, implemented several procedures and practices ensuring individuals with communication disabilities housed at the Clark County Jail are afforded equal access to all of CCSO Jail's services from the time booked through release.

An Effective Communication Coordinator (ECC) unit was created to facilitate any aid or services needed for those with communication disabilities while in the Jail. Staff and the ECC assist individuals requests as communication needs change for different types of activities.

At booking, an assessment is completed indicating any communication services needed or preferred for either themselves or communicating with a family member or friend.

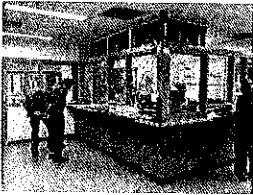
In person communication methods and services between Staff and the individual include but are not limited to ASL or other interpreters, tablets for typing conversation, pictograph, written notes, telecommunication and hearing assistive devices. Some of these aids can be used in the housing units as well. The TVs have closed captions turned on. Tablets, VRS, TTY and other telecommunication devices are available for communication with those outside of the housing unit and the Jail.

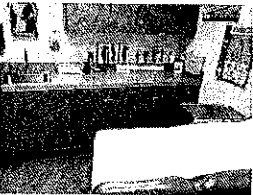

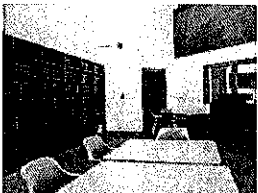

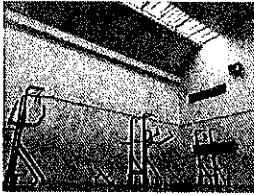

Jail Services Transition

On September 20, 2022, the Clark County Council approved a resolution to begin the transfer of management of the county jail from the Sheriff's Office to the County Manager's Office. An executive leadership team is in place and will begin October 17. It is anticipated that the transition will take several months. With the goal of providing information to the public, we are publicizing questions and answers. When updated, the date at the top will be updated and revision dates will be added to each specific question and answer if updated.

Q what is the current authority the sheriff has over the 'jail' versus the County Council?

The sheriff currently has full authority to set policy and procedures, govern the strategic direction, determine operations, including but not limited to, hiring/terminating employees, full time equivalent (FTE) allocation, facility maintenance, services provided, etc. and determine budget requests, priorities and expenditures.

The county council considers and approves the department budget and number of FTE that is presented by the sheriff and recommended through the county manager.

Q why was there a recommendation to transition the management of the jail from the Sheriff's Office to the County Manager's Office?

Jail services is a countywide service. This transition will allow additional resources to be allocated to the jail and at the same time, allow the sheriff to focus specifically on law enforcement in the community.

Q why wasn't a full transition plan developed prior to the creation of the new department?

The county wanted to ensure staff resources were utilized appropriately; therefore, the plan would be developed after the council considered and approved the new department. The transition plan will be developed and updated as this process is evolving.

Q will the County privatize the jail?

No. The county manager and council have publicly stated they are not discussing privatizing the jail.

Q Do other jurisdictions in the State that utilize this model?

There are a few jurisdictions that utilize this model including Spokane, King, Cowlitz, and Benton counties and SCORE which contracts with six cities just south of Seattle.

Other jurisdictions have seen more involvement, transparency, and intentional data-driven policies by utilizing advisory boards. Additionally, the specific focus on jail operations has been streamlined processes in the jail from intake throughout the entire law and justice system. Another benefit realized in Spokane County is that they are the only certified mental health facility jail in the state of Washington, ensuring those housed in the jail as well as trained staff have appropriate resources and services available.

Q Is the transaction done?

No, creating the new department of Jail Services was the first step in the transition.

Q was this decision made due to facility needs?

No. The sheriff has discussed over the years the need for facility updates and ensure adequate facility space is planned for to accommodate the population growth. While the sheriff currently has the ability to provide updates to the facilities (e.g. paint, fix broken doors, cleaning, etc.), the county has started a capital plan to update and/or build a new jail facility. There have been a couple prior studies completed that can be found on the county's website. Funding for architect and engineering will be on a council meeting agenda in October for their consideration – this is the first step to determine the best path forward and specific costing (e.g. full remodel, build new, look at other available options or a combination of all three).

Q Was this decision made due to the current elections of the Sheriff and/or Council candidates that are currently running for office?

No, it is acknowledged and understood how the timing and optics could lead to this question.

Q Why was the leadership team appointed for the new Jail Services department?

The new leadership team will lead the development and implementation of the transition plan, ensuring a smooth transition and continuity of service.

Q Why wasn't there a recruitment for the leadership team?

Human Resources Policy permits separate elected officials and the county manager to appoint certain positions that are unique. The leadership team of the newly formed Jail Services department consist of vast skillsets in jail leadership, operations and administration, including intimate knowledge of current jail operations. This team will lead the development and implementation of the transition plan, ensuring continuity of service.

the Jail Services leadership team and what unique skills set and attributes do they bring to the team?

David Shook has been appointed as director of Jail Services, Joe Barnett has been appointed as manager of jail administration and Bryan Pilakowski has been appointed as manager of jail operations.

Shook currently works for the Sheriff's Office and previously worked for Washington County for 25 years in both corrections and enforcement and held leadership roles in training and operations.

Barnett has worked for Clark County for more than 30 years and is currently a commander in corrections. Pilakowski has been with the Clark County Sheriff's Office for more than 20 years and is currently a corrections deputy. Both Barnett and Pilakowski have been instrumental in providing leadership in their respective positions in corrections.

Q were any of the Jail Services leadership team appointed due to their political aspirations or affiliation and/or personal relationships?

The leadership team was appointed solely based on their experience and expertise in jail leadership, operations and administration. Political affiliations are not known, explored nor considered as part of the hiring process. Additionally, prior political aspirations are personal to an applicant and are not the basis of a hiring decision. Of course, the ability to build personal relationships with all stakeholders is a key leadership attribute vital to the positions; which all three members of this leadership team possess.

Q when does the leadership team start in their new positions?

Monday, October 17, 2022. It is anticipated that the budget and full time equivalent employees (FTE) will be transitioned to the County Manager's Office in January 1, 2023 in conjunction with the budget process.

Q will the cost of the leadership team require additional funding that is not budgeted?

No, one position will remain in their current fully budgeted position and the other two positions will be placed in fully budgeted vacant positions.

Q who is in charge of the jail now?

The jail is still under the authority of the sheriff.

Q who makes decisions on operations and policy regarding the jail now?

The sheriff will continue to oversee the operations and policy for the jail. It has been communicated that they will work closely with the new Jail Services leadership team and collaborate on short- and long-term decisions directly impacting the jail.

Q When will the budget and full time equivalent (FTE) employees be transitioned to the County Manager's Office?

It is anticipated the budget and FTE will transition January 1, 2023, in conjunction with the budget process. With that said, there will be ongoing dialogue between departments after January 1, 2023, which may result in some transfers occurring at a later time.

it who is held in the jail and how long?

No. The judges currently, and will continue to, make the final determination on who is held in the jail and how long.

Q Does this transaction eliminate, limit or change in any way the sheriff's ability to enforce the law in the community?

No. The authority of the sheriff to enforce laws in the community is not impacted by this transition. Sheriff authority is defined in the Revised Code of Washington Chapter 36.28.

Q Does this transaction change the relationship between law enforcement and the jail?

No. The relationship between all law enforcement (e.g. sheriff, police departments) does not change with this transition.

Q Is funding or FTE being removed that support law enforcement in the community?

No. The only budget and FTE that will be transferred will be the budget and FTE that is allocated for corrections.

Q Will any employee lose their job?

No employee will lose their job.

Q What are examples of items that will be included and/or discussed as part of the transition plan?

Examples include budget, FTE, operations in the jail, interactions and support with other county departments (e.g. information technology, fleet, etc.), agreements with other jurisdictions and bargaining. Departments are currently brainstorming and listing out any items that may need to be further discussed.

Q Will anything be implemented or considered prior to the transition plan being complete?

Due to timing issues, there are a few items that we are currently reviewing now. One being an advisory board to provide policy recommendations to the leadership team and council. Advisory board members may include, but not limited to, law enforcement, local government jurisdictions, prosecuting attorney, courts, mental/behavioral support specialist and community members. It is anticipated council will be discussing this at a council time in October.

Additionally, there are discussions regarding utilizing mental health sales tax (MHST) funding that has already been collected for expansion of mental/behavioral supports and services in the jail. We are currently gathering a list of names of organizations and individuals that have these specific expertise to give to the MHST board. This will also be in line to maximize our ability to solidify funding through this process and the county's budget cycle.

There may be other items that can be initiated before the transition plan is complete.
